From the Supervisors: As we look back and reflect on the events of year 2014 a few special grant announcements and projects highlight the year.

The most significant announcement of the year came from Senator Richard Alloway when he announced that Washington Township would receive \$2,000,000.00 from PennDOT to complete a major section of the long awaited Washington Township Boulevard. When you see Senator Alloway thank him for his great statesmanship in obtaining this major grant for the township.

We would also like to thank the Franklin County Commissioners, David Keller, Robert Thomas and Robert Ziobrowski for two major grants that they have provided to the Township. The first one is the \$215,000 Grant to purchase and preserve the Maria Furnace Retreat Route from Gettysburg where the Battle of Monterey Pass was fought. This grant also preserved the Monterey Peak in Blue Ridge Summit forever.

The second grant from the County was for the completion of the Calimer Drive/Old Forge Road sewer project through the Community Development Block Grant program. The County has provided just under one-half million dollars for this project over 5 years. The project is scheduled for completion this summer.

In addition to grants to the Township, the Friends of the Battle of Monterey Pass received thousands of dollars of donations of money and building supplies/labor for the new Battlefield Museum that was completed this fall. What a wonderful addition to our community that was completed with very limited tax dollars.

On the economic front the township, through the hard work of Mike Ross and David Mackley are extremely happy to have two new industrial buildings being built in the Wharf Road Industrial Park. Both Fil-Tec and Pacemaker Press will open their doors to approximately 100 employees by mid-year 2015. What a wonderful addition to our community.

Also, on the economic front we would also like to mention that our new Hotel has been completed and is open for business. Please stop by the Cobblestone Hotel on Washington Township Boulevard and check out this new facility.

These major accomplishments highlight a year where many individuals working together continue to make Washington Township the great place that it is to live.

We would like to thank everyone who has had a hand in making these projects and the many other projects that we have not specifically mentioned above possible.

Budget 2015 – The Washington Township Supervisors approved the 2015 budget on December 15, 2014 without any tax increases for year 2015. Details of the budget may be seen on the township web page at www.washtwp-franklin.org or by stopping by the township office.

Septic System Pumping in 2014: If you are in area 2 of the Township, Route 316, Wayne Highway, East to Old Forge Road, you needed to have your septic tank pumped in year 2014. If you have not made arrangements to have your tank pumped, please do so immediately. If you have any questions or need a time extension, please contact the Township office at 762-3128.

Red Run and Pine Hill Pavilion Rentals: Pavilions at Red Run Park and Pine Hill may be rented for year 2015 beginning on Friday, January 2, 2015. Reservations will be taken beginning at approximately 8:00 a.m. However, people usually line up for reservations much earlier in the morning. Reservations are taken in the order of the number taken. Please use the meeting room at the back of the building as a place to wait.

Rental fee rates have not increased for 2015 and are as follows: At **Red Run Park**: Pavilion #1 - \$45.00; Pavilion #2 - \$55.00; Pavilion #3 - \$50.00; Pavilion #4 - \$45.00; Pavilion #5 - \$35.00. **Pine Hill Park**: The large pavilion (A) at Pine Hill - \$60.00 and Pavilions B & C - \$50.00.

Red Run's five pavilions range in seating capacity from 32 to 200 people, while the pavilions at Pine Hill range in seating capacity from 100 to 300 people. Payments are due with reservations. Reservations are not accepted by phone.

Christmas Tree Disposal: Christmas trees may be disposed of at the Washington Township Transfer Station for a fee of \$1.00. All trees will be recycled into mulch for reuse in the spring. Trees are welcome from everyone. The Transfer Station is open Monday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:15 p.m.

Transfer Station and Recycling Center: Please note that the Transfer Station and Recycling Center close on Wednesday, December 31, 2014 at **noon** and will be closed all day on Thursday, January 1, 2015.
