Free Paper Shredding...Free Paper Shredding.. Franklin County Planning Commission in cooperation with the Washington Township Supervisors and the Franklin County Commissioners have made arrangements again this year to have a document shredding truck available for the public's use on Renfrew's Pumpkin Festival, on Saturday, October 17, 2015.

Please remember that the following items will NOT be recycled: newspapers, 3-ring binders, carbon paper, film (X-ray or regular), heavy metal, cardboard boxes or trash, heavy plastics or plastic trash bags.

The shredder will be located in the parking lot at the Washington Township Municipal Offices at 13013 Welty Road along Welty Road from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. If you have specific questions on the paper shredding program please call Phil Tarquino at the FCPC Office at 261-3855.

Monterey Lane (North) Speed Reduction: The Township Supervisors adopted Ordinance #253 on Monday, September 21, 2015, which reduced the speed limit on Monterey Lane (North) to 25 MPH. For the safety of the traveling public and the neighborhood we request that you observe this new speed limit.

Changes to Park Regulations: Resolutions #604 to #610 amending the rules and regulations for Washington Township parks were approved at the September 9th meeting. Notable amendments include setting park "hours" from dawn to dusk in all Parks, banning the use of tobacco and electronic cigarettes in all parks, allowing dogs on leashes at Red Run Park, and allowing alcohol at Pine Hill Park for special events approved by the Board of Supervisors.
