

Ordinance No. 4

An Ordinance ordaining, laying out and opening certain roads at Blue Ridge Summit, Washington Township, to-wit: Orchard Avenue and Flohr Lane.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Supervisors of Washington Township, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Section 1. That a certain road named Orchard Avenue be and the same is hereby ordained, laid out, and opened on a course, the center line of which begins at a point along the Easterly side of Monterey Avenue known as Pennsylvania Highway Legislative Route No. 28027, which point is between lands of Melvin C. Bolan and wife and Hiram Eshelman and is marked by an iron pin; thence north $86^{\circ} 30$ minutes east 1513.9' to a point; thence on a curve to the left having a radius of 122.9' a distance of 94.97' to a point; thence north $42^{\circ} 13$ minutes east 548.8' to a point on the Southerly side of Township Road No. 377, said road having a total length of 2157.67' and being 33' in width.


Section 2. That a certain road named Flohr Lane be and the same is hereby ordained, laid out and opened on a course, the center line of which begins at Station 12 plus 90.15 on Orchard Avenue; thence north $31^{\circ} 26$ minutes east 217.85' to a point; thence north $27^{\circ} 14$ minutes east 282.85' to a point on the Southerly boundary line of Lot No. 2 on the plan of lots laid out by John S. Flohr, now owned by Lloyd M. Smith and wife, said road having a total length of 500.7' and being 20' in width.


Section 3. There is adopted as apart of this Ordinance a plan and map of the foregoing roads showing the location thereof as prepared by John H. McClellan, Registered Surveyor, June 17-21, 1954.


Section 4. Both of said roads shall hereafter be and become a part of the public road system of Washington Township.
