## ORDINANCE # 128

## AN ORDINANCE

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP, FRANKLIN COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 54, ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP ON SEPTEMBER 7, 1976.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Washington Township, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, adopted on September 7, 1976, Washington Township Ordinance No. 54; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Washington Township deems it to be in the interest and welfare of the residents of the Township to amend Ordinance No. 54 as described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Washington Township, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, that Ordinance No. 54 be amended as follows:

- SECTION 1. ARTICLE I, SECTION 1.01.J. is deleted in its entirety and the following is substituted in its place:
  - J. "Sanitary Sewage" shall mean normal water-carried household and toilet wastes from any Improved Property excluding such ground, surface or storm water as may be present.
- SECTION 2. ARTICLE II shall be amended to add Section 2.07. which shall read in its entirety as follows:
  - Section 2.07. No building floor drain, sump pump, drain spout, or any device permitting storm water, water table, or surface water to enter the Sewer shall be permitted.
- **SECTION 3. ARTICLE V, SECTION 5.01.** is deleted in its entirety and the following is substituted therefore:
  - SECTION 5.01. Any person who shall violate Section 2.07 of this Ordinance shall be liable, upon summary conviction for a first offense and upon summary conviction for each subsequent offense, to a fine of not less than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), together with costs of prosecution in each case. Any person who shall

violate any other provision of this Ordinance shall be liable, upon summary conviction for a first offense and upon summary conviction for each subsequent offense, to a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00), together with costs of prosecution in each case. Each day that a violation shall continue shall be deemed and shall be taken to be a separate offense and shall be punishable as such.

SECTION 4. In all other respects the provisions of Ordinance No. 54, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after adoption.
