ORDINANCE NO. 223

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMITS ON CERTAIN ROADS WITHIN WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, there are certain streets and roads with established speed limits within Washington Township upon which speed limit determining conditions have changed; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Township Board of Supervisors, in order to advance the welfare and safety of the residents of the Township and such other persons who use said roads, deems it necessary to enact speed limitations on certain roads in Washington Township; and

WHEREAS, the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, Section 6109 provides for the establishing of speed limits on roads; and

WHEREAS, Section 3362a(1.2) of the Vehicle Code provides for the establishment of a maximum speed of 25 mph in any residential district; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors, after completing traffic studies of the following roads, finds them to meet the definition of the residential district criteria as per the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is enacted and ordained, by the Board of Supervisors of this Township, as follows:

Section 1. The maximum speed limit for the following roads is hereby established as follows:

Road	<u>From</u>	<u>To</u>	Speed Limit
1. Mentzer Gap Road T-378	Greenridge Drive T-503	400 feet east of Valleywood Drive T-434	25 MPH
2. Scott Road T-360	PA Rt. 16	2000 feet south of PA Rt. 16	25 MPH

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be enforced in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania as it pertains to fines and other penalties.

Section 3. Should any provision of this Ordinance be found unconstitutional or otherwise illegal or in any other manner unenforceable, the remaining sections of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective as provided by law.
