

RESOLUTION

ADOPTING AS A COOPERATING CONSTITUENT MUNICIPALITY THE "FRANKLIN COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN" PREPARED FOR THE FRANKLIN COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT 241.

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of Pennsylvania has passed the Pennsylvania Solid Waste Management Act, Act 241 and it was signed into law by the Governor of the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, Act 241 requires that certain municipalities in the Commonwealth shall submit to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources (Department) an officially adopted plan for solid waste systems serving the area within their jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Department has recommended to the County of Franklin that the planning be accomplished at the County level, on a regional basis by the County Planning Commission (Commission); and

WHEREAS, the Commission, in order to satisfy the Act 241 planning requirements, has prepared a County-wide Solid Waste Plan, entitled the "Franklin County Solid Waste Management Plan" (Plan); and

WHEREAS, this County-wide Plan is to be officially adopted by this same form of resolution in accordance with the Pennsylvania Act 241 by all Franklin County municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the County-wide Plan is the result of a cooperative effort by the County municipal governing bodies consistent with each official municipal Solid Waste Management Plan, as well as regional planning objectives; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has coordinated the joint effort, included all County municipalities and synthesized individual municipal plans in the County-wide Plan; and


WHEREAS, any implementation or change in the "Franklin County Solid Waste Management Plan" in relation to a particular County municipality shall be provided for review by that municipality before any action is taken;


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Governing Body of Washington Township adopts the "Franklin County Solid Waste Management Plan" as submitted by the Franklin County Planning Commission, subject to approval by the State Department of Environmental Resources.
