RESOLUTION NO. 384

**OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THIS TOWNSHIP
ADOPTING REASONABLE RULES AND REGULATIONS
CONCERNING THE USE OF TOWNSHIP RIGHT-OF-WAY
BY WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY**

WHEREAS, the Township of Washington Ordinance No. 42 provides the Township with the right to adopt reasonable rules and regulations concerning the use of Township rights-of-way by the Washington Township Municipal Authority (hereinafter referred to as WTMA) for WTMA sewer and water systems; and

WHEREAS, Township of Washington desires to adopt rules and regulations concerning the construction of water booster stations, sewer pump stations and other similar facilities within the Township right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Washington, that whenever developers desire to install water booster stations/sewer pump stations or other similar facilities within the Township right-of-way, the following must be complied with:


1. The developer must sign a contract agreeing to indemnify the Township for any losses incurred by the Township for any reason as a result of the water booster station, sewer pump station or similar facilities being located within the Township right-of-way.
2. WTMA must also sign a similar indemnification agreement.

If the developer and/or WTMA do not sign such agreements, then the facilities shall not be built within the Township right-of-way and should be constructed on private property to be dedicated to the WTMA.
