A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THIS
TOWNSHIP AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP'S CODE ENFORCEMENT
OFFICER, THE TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT,
ASSISTANT TOWNSHIP MANAGER, OR THE TOWNSHIP MANAGER TO
DETERMINE A NUISANCE IN FACT EXISTS ON
PROPERTIES IN THE TOWNSHIP.

WHEREAS, the Code of the Township of Washington, Franklin County PA, in Chapter 216, provides the Township with the legal authority to prohibit nuisances on properties in the Township; and

WHEREAS, Section 216-3 provides the Board of Supervisors, Township Manager, Assistant Township Manager, Township Code Enforcement Officer or the Township Police Department can cause written notice to the owner of property if a Nuisance is permitted to exist; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors would like to establish a list of Township personnel that can declare a "nuisance in fact".

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of this Township as follows:

The Township Code Enforcement Officer, the Township Police Department, the Assistant Township Manager, or the Township Manager can make the determination as to whether or not one of the prohibited activities as set forth in Section 216-2 of the Code of the Township of Washington constitute a nuisance in fact based on actual conditions in the Township.
