

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 2

An ordinance ordaining, laying out and opening a certain street in Rouzerville, Washington Township, Franklin County, Pennsylvania.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Supervisors of Washington Township, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same.

Section I: That a certain street in Rouzerville be and the same is hereby ordained, laid out and opened on a course, the center line of which begins at a point on the south edge of the right-of-way of Pennsylvania Highway Route No. 16, Pennsylvania Legislative Route No. 44, opposite Station No. 280 / 06 as shown on the plan of said Legislative Route approved by the Governor of Pennsylvania: thence South 11 degrees 18 minutes West 181.8 feet to a point; thence South 18 degrees 27 minutes 177.2 feet to a point; thence South 22 degrees 48 minutes West 151.7 feet to a point; thence South 23 degrees 18 minutes West 179 feet to a point on the North edge of the right-of-way of Pennsylvania Legislative Route No. 28068. Said street having a total length of 690 feet and being 22 feet in width, all of which shall be used as a roadway.

Section II: There is adopted as a part of this ordinance, the plan and map of the foregoing street showing the location thereof, as prepared by Harry Knox, R. E.

Section III: Said street shall hereafter be and become part of the public road system of Washington Township.

Ordained and enacted into an ordinance this 3rd day of May, 1952.
